FAQ's

1. *Can I enter any class?* – Of course! (except where otherwise stated)
2. *Does all fruit and veg have to be grown by me?* – Yes; all exhibits for prizes must be grown in your garden/allotment, except for the floral arranging classes.
3. *Can two people enter the same class with produce from the same garden?* – Just **one** exhibit from **one** garden in each class please.
4. *Where do I put my exhibits on the day of the show?* - All exhibits must be delivered and staged in the show tent at the **Chalke Valley Sports Centre** between **8.00am and 10.00am on Saturday 15th August**. The judges will arrive at 10.00am when the tent must be vacated.
5. *What do I do if I can't place my exhibits in the tent on show day?* – Fret not! Entries may be delivered to **Sara Moss, Coach Cottage, Tank Lane, Broad Chalke, SP5 5EP** to arrive no later than 18:00pm on Friday 14th August and will be placed in the tent for you.
6. *Help! I haven't had time to enter classes but I have made my exhibits for them.* – Not a problem! Late entries are accepted at **£2** per entry per class at the **Chalke Valley Sports Centre between 8am and 9am on show morning or you can enter online until midnight on the day before the show**
7. *When can I remove my exhibits?* – Please leave them until after the prize giving but remove them before 4:30pm or they will be disposed of.
8. *How are cups awarded?* - Cups are awarded on a points earned system. The person who gains the most points in any section will be awarded the Cup. In the event of a tie, the person with the largest number of prize-winning exhibits will be declared the winner. In the event of a tie at this stage, the exhibitor with the most First Prizes will be declared the winner. Points will be awarded as follows: **1st prize – 3 points, 2nd prize – 2 points, 3rd prize (if applicable) – 1 point.**
9. **Entry forms + fees please to the Broad Chalke village hall on Tuesday August 11th between 6pm and 8pm or at the Hub on Friday 14th August between 10am and 12 midday.** Alternatively you can book online until midnight on Friday 14th August
10. Prize money will be given out after prize giving.

A FEW OFFICIAL THINGS...

- o Liability for loss – All exhibits and personal property shall be at risk of the exhibitor. The Committee shall not be liable for any compensation for loss/damage
- o If the show is not held for any reason, no exhibitor shall have any claims on the Committee
- o The Committee have the right to restrict removal of any cup from the Chalke Valley
- o The judge's decision is final

PLEASE REMEMBER...

- o Not to display your name anywhere on your exhibit
- o To place your sticker **clearly** on your exhibit – the top number is your number, the bottom number is the class number
